# SEX, DRUGS, AND ROCK 'N' ROLL

In 2023, we conducted the annual Sex, Drugs, and Rock 'n' Roll survey. 794 young people aged 15–29 years completed the online survey. We asked about their sexual behaviours, knowledge of sexually transmissible infections (STIs), pornography use, perceptions of long COVID, and alcohol and other drug use.

## Demographics

- The average age was 23 years
- 87% were born in Australia
- **69%** were currently studying at high school, university, or TAFE
- 58% lived with their parent/s

- **55%** woman
- **34%** man
- 13% non-binary

## Sexual Behaviours

82% ever had oral sex
73% ever had vaginal intercourse
35% ever had anal intercourse

Participants were asked 7

## Of the 566 people who reported penetrative vaginal or anal sex in the past 12 months...

- 90% had a regular partner (boyfriend, girlfriend, other partner)
- 38% had a casual partner (one-night stand, friends with benefits)
- 34% had a new partner in the past 3 months
- 57% ever had an STI test
- 42% used a condom the last time they had vaginal sex (n=558)

# Long COVID

We defined as symptoms for >4 weeks following infection

- 79% reported ever having a short-term COVID-19 infection
- 11% of participants reported ever having long COVID
- 6% had a current long COVID infection

- Almost half (49%) of participants had family or friends who had experienced long COVID
- 15% needed to support family or friends in managing their infection



#### Impacts reported among those with a current long COVID infection (45 participants)



# **Alcohol & Other Drug Use**

86% drank alcohol in the past year
50% had ever used an e-cigarette
10% were current smokers

## Illicit Drugs



- 61% had ever used illicit or non-prescribed drug
- Of these participants,
   **52%** had done so in the last month
