SEX, DRUGS, AND Rock 'N' Roll

Results summary 2024

In 2024, we conducted the annual *Sex, Drugs, and Rock 'n' Roll* survey. From March to May, 1016 young people aged 15 to 29 completed the online survey.

We asked about knowledge of and preferences for sexual health. We also asked about sexual behaviours, pornography use, and alcohol and other drug use. See some of our findings below.
